ADDITIONAL QUESTIONS

1. What opportunities does the Town of Eagle have?

Eagle is at an inflection point in its development as a community. ReCode Eagle and the Grand Ave Corridor transformation will be setting the framework for our development for decades to come. Growth (or blight) doesn't just happen. They are direct reflections of the policies we enact today.

2. What challenges currently exist in the Town of Eagle?

The town has an over-reliance on Planned Use Developments (PUDs). Look at the example of the Nock Subdivision, Eagle Interchange South, and the Lofts along Eby Creek Rd. If it takes a PUD to develop a 2-4 buildings, then there is a problem with the town land use codes. This is our chance to fix it. A community undergoing rapid development ultimately runs out developable land and its population plateaus toward build out. As a county that is over three quarters federal land, we will see that plateau sooner than most. Approximately 25-30 years after the development boom, we will hear the echo in our municipal budgets. Permit and impact fees will slow to a trickle. The town will face a new wave of infrastructure replacement costs from aging improvements that the developer originally installed. Have we structured our budget to anticipate this new reality?

3. As a Council/Committee Member, how would you approach these challenges?

Our land use and building codes are the forces that shape the development to come. Municipal fees and credits are tools we can use to incentivize movement in the directions we choose.

Zoning is the color by numbers of our future, not just the reality of today.

The Town has myriad opportunities on the horizon, and I will highlight three below:

1. Institutional Trust- With new staff and new residents, the Town has an opportunity to bring people in through communication and outreach and reliable and cost effective services. The nonprofit sector is on the cutting edge of meaningful stakeholder engagement, codesign, and mutual trust. We can take best practices from the sector to close feedback loops, identify misunderstanding or tension, and better understand emerging needs. Pairing this engagement with increased staff capacity and commitment to high performance in town services, we can build the institutional trust needed in our town and nation.
2. Transit and Climate Leadership- Eagle has already taken steps to be a climate leader in the mountain west. The Town should capitalize on this investment by celebrating our accomplishments with residents. The next opportunity for green transformation lies in transit. We can reduce VMTs and increase health and social connectivity with dynamic multimodal transit.
3. Culture and Arts- Eagle has a rich, rural character and more

diversity than meets the eye. Our Town's outdoor amenities are a true treasure, and so are our local artists, musicians, and creatives. We have so much to showcase. I envision an Eagle with a truly inclusive arts scene and that is proud of our many cultures. This can be accomplished with increased coordination and scheduling of events and a values-based vision for the arts.

2. What challenges currently exist in the Town of Eagle?

A major challenge for the Town of Eagle is growth. As our population increases, how do we ensure the diversity of residents that contributes to a vibrant economy and culture? How do we ensure reliable and cost effective services at scale and engage with the public to strengthen institutional trust? In ten years, Eagle will be much hotter and much dryer. How do we prepare current residents and newcomers to continue to thrive in that reality?

3. As a Council/Committee Member, how would you approach these challenges?

Our most pressing challenges are persistent and have dogged the Town for decades. We need new frameworks for understanding these issues and creative solutions. We need better, real time information and future-focused metrics. As a leader, I believe the future depends on broadening the scope of our ROI. We must put forth a vision of the future that challenges the patterns of the past.

By leveraging local institutions and foundations with expertise, all players in a community can be a part of systems change that helps to move the needle on critical issues. Systems thinking, sound evidence, and collaboration are critical components that foster resiliency and make rural communities thrive. This is the philosophy I would bring to the role of Councilmember.
